Whether they are crooning a poignant ballad or



delivering a rollicking fiddle tune, their unique arrangements are especially engaging and often seasoned with history and humor

With their smiles, spirit, sparkling musicianship and multiple CDs the Gawlers have earned a beloved place in the delighted hearts of varied audiences across the Northeast.

Ellen has recorded with *Trillium*, *The Ladies of the Lake*, *Childsplay*, etc. and brings Maritime, Irish, New England, Shetland, Quebecois tunes to family CDs.

John is known for his fun-loving, original renditions of traditional music. He joins his family in *Childsplay* & toured internationally with *Old Grey Goose*.

Molly has toured, singing world music in *Village Harmony*, performing with the *Childsplay fiddle orchestra*, and dancing in *Pilobolus*, etc. She has produced *Honey Dreams*, an album of lullabies featuring her voice and the wooden banjo.

He has appeared on numerous broadcasts, including National Public Radio's ***A Prairie Home Companion***. Known for his carefully written, poetic offerings, his body of work has provided material for an eclectic list of artists that includes Alison Krauss, Pete Seeger, Arlo Guthrie Hal Ketchum, Emmylou Harris, John Denver and the Muppets.

He continues to write thoughtful, potent songs about changing America – small town Main Street, relationships disintegrated or

rich tradition. Blending distinctive voices and a wide range of accompaniment (guitar, harmonica, ukulele, clarinet, penny whistle, electric bass), their songs have been well-received by audiences around the eastern United States and Canada since 2010.


