## MESSAGE FROM THE SELECTMEN

To the residents and friends of Vienna:

### Selectmen's Meeting Minutes

#### Selectman's Meeting - October 2, 2007

Present: Dodi Thompson, Chris Smith, Brian Church, Linwood Meader, Marti Gross, Beth Evans from K.J.

1. The paving of our roads has started with Pike Industries doing the work. Most of the "grinding is done. There is a little more grinding to do on the Kimball Pond Rd. This will be completed after "Dig Safe" comes and checks out the road.
2. The selectmen have been getting some phone calls about the increase in the second tax bill. We must remember that the first bill is an estimate only. We can only finalize the mil rate after we receive the school budget and our percentage of valuation as set by the State.
3. We received (from the Maine Municipal Association) the "General Assistance Ordinance Appendices" for 2007. These are yearly changes in the monetary guidelines used to determine General Assistance eligibility. We will vote to accept or not accept these changes at our next meeting on October 16th .

4. Reviewed and signed Warrant #19
5. Linwood asked Brian if the Fire Department could help him with a plugged culvert on the Jesse Ladd Rd. Brian said that the Fire Department will try and unplug it Thursday night, October 4th during their meeting.

1. Opened and went over mail.
2. Linwood reports that he has talked to the paving company (Pike Industries) and they said that the work should be completed in Vienna by October 19th. He also

3. Selectmen went over the Comprehensive Plan Account budget with treasurer Marti Gross.
4. Adjourned to attend the Comprehensive Plan Committee meeting at 7:00 at the Community Building.

Pike Industries, the paving contractor. The paving equipment has started arriving in Vienna so the paving should begin this week. Linwood also reports he has been working on the Kimball Pond Rd and the Mountain Rd.

2. Read & accepted Minutes from October 2nd and October 9th .
3. The Selectmen have received Grant information from The Maine Emergency Management Agency. This info has been passed along to the Fire Department.
4. The Town of Vienna has received a sign and Certificate of Recognition from Northstar EMS and Franklin Memorial Hospital stating that Vienna is a "Heart Safe Community". Brian will display them in the Community Room.
5. The Selectmen voted to accept the new "General Assistance Ordinance Appendices" for 2007 & 2008.
6. Reviewed and signed Warrant #20
7. Selectmen signed the fourth year option addendum to the contract for "Off road Snow Plowing" with Barry Emery dba Emery Enterprises. This covers the 2007-2008 season.
8. Dodi gave a report from the last "Town House Committee" meeting that she attended. At this meeting they went over the plans for the new office and bathroom to be added to the Town House. The Selectmen have a few concerns that they would like to bring to the committee's next meeting on Monday, October 29th. Dodi and Brian plan to attend the meeting.
9. There was discussion of the Comprehensive Plan meeting with town officials that all the selectmen attended last week.
10. Brian brought up the fact that he has some concerns that the Vienna Union Hall insurance is on the Town's umbrella policy. His concern was that the Union Hall has functions from time to time where people are allowed to bring alcohol. Dodi pointed out the Union Hall does pay its portion of the policy premium and that the insurance company says the Vienna Union Hall Association is responsible for any claims made against them.

**Selectmen's Meeting - October 23, 2007**

1. Read & accepted Minutes from October 16.
2. Bob Weingarten came in to look at his tax cards and maps
3. The Town of Vienna has received a letter from the State of Maine , Department of Public Safety, asking if we are going to contract with the Central Maine Regional Communication Center to handle our 911 calls and Fire Department dispatching. We will draft a letter to the above stating that we will not be

contracting with them at this time; we will continue to use the Winthrop dispatch center.

4. Selectmen received the certificate of liability insurance and the letter of bonding for Meader Construction for the 2007-2008 snowplow season.

**Selectmen's Meeting - October 30, 2007**

1. Linwood reported that the "winter salt and sand" is all put up. Pike Industries has also completed the paving projects.
2. Selectmen spent the rest of the meeting working on filing and dispensing paperwork.

**Selectman's Meeting November 6, 2007**

1. The town has received a \$500 check from the "Lakes Environmental Association". This is the final installment of a grant from the D.E.P. for the "Invasive Plant Program" to be used in the Lake Warden Account.

**Selectmen's Meeting - November 13, 2007**

1. Read and accepted minutes from October 23, October 30, and November 6, 2007.
2. Dodi reported on a conversation she had with the office of Stephen Langsdorf, attorney for the Town of Vienna. So far no court date has been set for the trial of the lawsuit of Hall vs. Vienna.
3. It was noted that the Town of Vienna had an approximate 46% turnout for last week's election.
4. Selectmen went over correspondence and reviewed bills for the next warrant.

# 30 Mile River Watershed Association

Over the past year, numerous town officials and lake association members in the “30-mile river watershed,” from Kimball pond down to the Androscoggin Deadwater, have been working on forming a non-profit corporation to protect the watershed. Vienna’s 7-8 year lake warden program was the local model, but the group has sought out other similar organizations in Maine as it has put together its plans. It now has draft bylaws and articles of incorporation and is on target to become incorporated by the first of 2008 and to expand previous years’ Vienna lake warden program to other waters in the watershed by next summer. An outline of its overall strategy is below.

## PURPOSE:

To preserve, improve, and protect the land and water quality in the 30 mile river watershed\*.

## GOALS:

1. Invasive plant education, interception and detection
2. Water quality/safety monitoring
  - a. Point and non-point pollution education, detection and prevention
  - b. Watershed/wetland education and protection
  - c. Shore land zoning education and compliance
3. Boat law education and compliance

## WHAT IT WILL BE:

Form a non-profit corporation this fall with elected officers, bylaws, and a board of directors from watershed lake associations, towns and land trusts. Application for 501c3 status would follow incorporation under Maine laws; this would also allow tax-deductible contributions for non-qualified lake associations as well as the possibility of shared services (e.g. newsletters)

## HOW IT WILL BE FUNDED:

By expanding lake association, town, and public commitments, participation, and financial support, as well as grants from government (DEP milfoil, 319 [non-point pollution]), and foundations

## NEXT STEPS:

1. Become an incorporated non-profit corporation this fall.
2. Create a seasonal director position to implement the goals of the association; staff with seasonal, towns-appointed lake warden (s) (under state inland harbormaster laws) as well as part-time and volunteer positions
3. Apply for 501c3 status

*\*The 30 Mile River Watershed includes the towns of Vienna, New Sharon, Mt. Vernon, Fayette, Chesterville, Leeds, Wayne, and Readfield; extant lake associations are: Kimball Pd, Flying Pd, Parker Pd, Echo Lake, Lovejoy Pd, David/Basin/Tilton Pds, Pocasset Lake, and Androscoggin Lake; extant land trusts: Kennebec, Androscoggin and the Kennebec Highlands of the Belgrade Regional Conservation Alliance.*

## **Selectmen Meeting** from page 2

At the meeting: Dodi Thompson, Chris Smith, Linwood Meader, Steve Lilley, Beth Evans from KJ.

1. Selectmen Brian Church is still in recovery at the Farmington hospital. We all send him our best wishes that he will be home soon and continue to get better.
2. Road Commissioner Linwood Meader reported on work he is doing on several of the town roads - work that needs to be done before the first big snow storm of the season.
3. Fire Chief Steve Lilley reported that he, along with the other Mutual Aid Fire Chiefs will attend the Mt. Vernon selectmen’s meeting Wednesday, November 28 at 7:00. A representative from the Skowhegan dispatching center will be giving information on their service. Dodi will also

- attend that meeting.
4. Town officials have been invited to meet with the County Commissioners, on Thursday night, the 29th at 5:30 to discuss the ramifications of the closing of the Kennebec County Dispatch Center on January 31, 2008. Also on the 29th, at 6:30, Steve, along with other fire chiefs, will tour the new State Dispatching Facility in Augusta.
5. There was a discussion of the icy conditions on Route 41 (Town House Rd.) last Tuesday. The state uses calcium chloride, which does not seem to be as effective as sand. After a bad accident that afternoon, the town asked our contractor to do some sanding in the area for safety reasons. The state does not reimburse the town for the sand on such occasions, but we feel it is necessary for public safety.

## Forget the Diet: Eat Well and Live Lively

January 20 through 26, 2008 is the 15th Annual Healthy Weight Week.

Thinking of going on a diet in the New Year? Think again.

Most diets result in ineffective, short-term weight loss and then quickly gaining back the pounds that were lost. Dieting disrupts normal eating, creates a preoccupation with food, can result in malnutrition, and can lead to eating disorders.

Instead, this year choose to eat well, live actively, and feel good about yourself and others. By eating well and being more physically active, excess weight will come off naturally. The key is to get more active. It takes time, but this is the healthy and lasting way to lose weight.

Eating normally typically includes three nutritious meals a day with breakfast being very important. Include one or two nutritious snacks to satisfy your hunger. Eat when you are hungry, and stop when you are satisfied.

What is a healthy weight?

A healthy weight is different for everyone. A person's weight is based on factors such as genes, food intake, and level of physical activity. Therefore, it is impossible to have one ideal weight that suits everybody. Healthy weight is not just about weight loss. It includes lifestyle, eating habits, and good nutrition, combined with physical activity. Eating in a healthy way provides the human body with the nutrients it needs to function, so what a person eats directly affects the body's well-being and a person's quality of life.

How does healthy weight influence a person's life?

Being at a healthy weight and eating healthy can enhance feelings of well-being and provide the needed energy to lead a fulfilling life. Maintaining a healthy weight is an important part of self-esteem, because your weight affects your body image, emotions, moods, and physical sensations.

What can be done to reach and stay at a healthy weight?

Efforts to get Americans to maintain a healthy weight begins with our Nation's children. Parents have an important role to play, because they are typically the primary source of information. More importantly, they are the primary role models when it comes to molding children's eating habits. Children learn from their parents what to eat, when to eat, and how much to eat. For children and adults alike, it is important to get in touch

Three reasons not to diet:

- Diets don't work; dieters regain weight and often regain more than they lost.
- Dieting disrupts normal regulation and throws the body into a stressful, defensive state.
- Dieting leads to disordered eating and is the primary precursor for eating disorders.

with body signals that tell you when you are hungry, full, or have overeaten. Adults who wish to change their behaviors, attitudes, and lifestyle patterns in order to reach a healthy weight should begin by getting reliable information on nutrition. Local communities programs like Healthy Community Coalition's get Out and Live or GOAL in Franklin County and Move More in Kennebec and Somerset Counties can provide support and help to promote understanding of the importance of healthy weight to a good quality of life.

# Questions about Recyclables

We have had questions regarding specific recyclables and have some answers for you.

- Waxed milk and beverage containers are not accepted even from those of you who meticulously wash them and remove the plastic spouts.
- Paint cans can be recycled on bulky waste day. They must be dry and empty. To dispose of paint see the information below about the Hazardous waste Depot in Lewiston
- Propane tanks can be recycled at Waste Management in Norridgewock. They accept both the small 1 lb camping ones and the larger 20 lb.
- Batteries can be recycled at Waste Management, all types. Keep a container handy for all those used batteries and put it out with Universal waste.

Both the propane tanks and all batteries can be recycled on Bulky pickup day. (May, July, Oct)

The transfer station in Norridgewock will accept colored glass if taken by individuals. Neither of the two transfer stations we deal with will accept anything other than #2 plastics. When putting recyclables out at curbside pack them separately in open bags. The workers will not open bags that are tied closed. They appreciate your sorted, clean and dry recycling efforts.

Hazardous waste: There is a Depot for Hazardous waste in Lewiston that is open to the public.

- It is located at the Lewiston Solid waste facility at 424 River Road.
- Hours are 8:00 -12:00 the first and third Saturdays of each month April through November.
- You will be charged a disposal fee that is measured in "Units" \$25.00 for 5 gal of liquid or

20 lbs of solid waste, or a combination of the two.

If residents have questions about any items they would like to recycle call one of the Merry Dumpsters. We are happy to find the answers for you.

Please note A few changes to the recycling: Curbside is no longer accepting colored glass Plastics have expanded to include colored #2

**Q.** What happens to the plan now?

**A.** The Plan was submitted to Maine State Planning Office on November 9th. The State Planning Office will review the plan for completeness and for consistency with the Growth Management Act. It is a two tier review to determine: (1) completeness - the plan covers all the topic areas required by the Act and the contract for grant funding; and (2) consistency - the plan recommends everything specified in the Act and accompanying rules. The State Planning Office review will take 60 days. The Comprehensive Plan Committee can expect to receive the State Planning Office comments in early January. The Committee will then review the comments and hold a public meeting to obtain input on the Plan and the state comments. The Committee will then revise the Plan, if appropriate.
