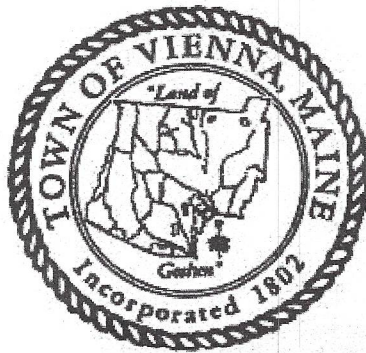

Report of the Selectmen 2023

2023 was a very busy year for your Board of Selectmen. We accomplished much and faced many challenges along the way. Here is a synopsis:

- We contracted with Parker Appraisal Services to do a long-overdue, town-wide property reassessment. This task required a large amount of work before it even began as new tax cards had to be created for each and every property in Vienna. The site visits happened over the summer and early fall. We expect to have the new evaluations soon.
- In May and again in December, we (like so much of our state) experienced destructive weather events causing great damage to town roads. Thank you to Danny Goucher and his crew for all the work they have done to restore the roads. But it drained our road budget and then some. We have been working with FEMA to get some reimbursement for storm repairs. In addition, thank you to Troy Bean and his crew for their work as they have had to plow damaged and not-yet-frozen roads without causing more damage. The task has been huge for both crews.
- In November, we began working with the Community Resiliency Partnership, a program of GrowSmart Maine, which assists town in acquiring grant money to address community issues primarily related to climate change. Initially, we are addressing damage done to roads and culverts by the more frequent storms. A small group of residents are working together on this which takes some of the work off the Board of Selectmen. With all that is happening this year, we are grateful.
- We have installed heat pumps to the Town House for heat in the winter and cooling in the summer in a more efficient way. These were made possible by the continued financial legacy of Dorothy Waugh.
- And lastly, we finally made great strides in creating the Vienna Broadband Authority to bring high-speed, fiber-optic broadband service to Vienna. The contract with the service provider and grant agreement with Maine Connectivity were signed in late December after months and months of work and negotiations. Thank you to Jim Anderberg and the Broadband Committee. Be sure to read Jim's report later in this book.

A reminder that the Board of Selectmen meet every Tuesday (except when there is a 5th Tuesday in a month). We begin at 6:30 p.m. The 1st and 3rd Tuesdays begin with warrants (a.k.a. bills are approved for payment). The 2nd and 4th Tuesdays are work sessions. The public with welcome. It continues to be our privilege to serve our community.

Vienna Broadband Authority

It took longer than we expected, but the \$2.2 million dollar grant from the Maine Connectivity Authority for Vienna's community owned fiber optic network finally got contract approval on December 21 of last year. An auspicious time for the coming of the light. This significant milestone marks a new era of connectivity and innovation for our community. With fiber-to-the-home, we are paving the way for lightning-fast internet speeds, reliable connections, and a host of opportunities that will transform the way we live and work.

The next phase will be the "pole make-ready" process. This process involves preparing existing utility poles to accommodate the new infrastructure, ensuring a safe and efficient environment for the installation of cables and equipment. Once that is complete we can begin the construction phase, estimated to be late summer and into the fall of 2024. Those residences that have pre-subscribed for the free installation will be connected at that time.

If all goes well it's estimated that we will be up and running by December 2024.

Vienna Fire Department 2023 Report

It was another busy year for the Vienna Fire Department with a total of 67 calls. An overwhelming majority of the calls were responding to Mutual Aid, rescue assists, and various other calls that included alarm activations, downed trees and power lines, ice water rescues, and multiple motor vehicle accidents. There were 19 fire-specific calls this year, five of which occurred in Vienna.

Following in the footsteps of the last two years, chicken BBQ was again, a huge success. The beautiful weather made for a day of delicious food and great community. We continue to be grateful for everyone who keeps coming back year after year, and for the new folks we get to welcome. We cooked more chicken this year than ever before and sold every last piece before the BBQ was even over. We are looking forward to serving you all again this year – save the date for Sunday, July 28th for some of the most delicious food around!

In our continued effort to serve the community, the Department spent ten hours cleaning chimneys this year and completed over 31 hours of training and work sessions both internally and with the Mount Vernon Fire Department. The chiefs of both departments look forward to training with each other in the coming year.

We were excited to welcome some new members this year and are always looking for more. Join us Thursday evenings at the fire station on Kimball Pond Road if you are interested in meeting the crew and learning about what it means to be a volunteer firefighter.

Mount Vernon Rescue 2023

Rescue responded to 245 emergency calls during 2023. Forty-eight of these occurred in Vienna, (43 in 2022).

Calls by month as follows;

January	5	July	6
February	4	August	4
March	2	September	0
April	5	October	6
May	6	November	1
June	3	December	6

Thirty-one of our calls occurred during the daytime shift (6AM-6PM) and seventeen during the nighttime shift (6PM-6AM).

We provided treatment for 37 patients, 23 were transported by NorthStar ambulance to Franklin Memorial Hospital, three were transported to MaineGeneral Medical Center. Nine patients were not transported and for one we were canceled en route. One patient was taken by LifeFlight.

I'd like to start this report by acknowledging the passing of Patricia Rawson, long-time director. Pat was one of the driving forces in making Mt. Vernon Rescue into the high quality first responder agency that serves the towns of Mt. Vernon and Vienna today. Pat was always a familiar sight on many scenes and was able to connect with patients in her special way. Pat was a big part of the community and we miss her presence daily.

Our current active membership of rescue is five. Dr. Rachel Criswell continues her role as our Medical Director. She meets with us quarterly to review runs and answer questions.

We continue to have the support of the Vienna firefighters who respond along with us to rescue calls, as well as the support of Laura Church, the Fire Department Chaplain. Their assistance has proven to be invaluable. Rarely is there a call without Vienna firefighters there to help us with directions, marking the location of the scenes and providing any assistance we may require.

We encourage anyone who has an interest in what rescue does or what is involved in becoming part of this team to contact any rescue member. Each one of us started out in the same place, most with no medical background. We are currently recruiting new members. Please consider becoming part of this rewarding service.

I would like to thank all the Vienna citizens for your support of rescue. Your gratitude at call, your notes of thanks and your support at town meetings are appreciated.

2023 PLANNING BOARD REPORT

In 2023 the Planning Board issued twenty four permits with a total construction cost estimate of \$1,871,200. Eleven of those permits were for activities within the Shoreland Zone. Five permits were issued for new residences, two for camps, three for garages or carports, six for sheds, four for decks and porches, two for additions, one for stairs within the Shoreland Zone and one for tree cutting within the Shoreland Zone. The six lot Kohtala Family Living Trust subdivision was approved.

The Planning Board administers the Subdivision Ordinance, the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance, the Notification of Construction Ordinance, the Wireless Telecommunications Facilities Siting Ordinance, and the Floodplain Management Ordinance. Additionally, Consolidated Communications and Central Maine Power Company require Planning Board, or other town official, approval for any new service connections. Although the town no longer requires Timber Harvest permits, harvesters must obey the state rules, and harvesting within the Shoreland Zone may require a permit under that ordinance.

Planning Board members are Tim Bickford, Creston Gaither, Ed Lawless, Waine Whittier, and Alan Williams. We would like to have one or two alternate members added to the Board. The Board meets the fourth Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Town House.

Dr Shaw Memorial Library Annual Report for the year 2023

Staff and Trustees at the Dr Shaw Memorial Library are so grateful that the library has bounced back and resumed healthy activities with increased patron visits and circulation of materials since Covid. Many habits changed during the pandemic and we needed to adjust our offerings such as providing more access to digital viewing of movies and books, offering take and make crafts, and free passes. Many people switched to audio books and streamed movies, but are now trickling back to the “book in hand.”

Our subscription to Hoopla, the Maine State Download Library, Comics Plus, and our passes to the Boothbay Botanical Gardens have seen much use.

We have been able to provide programming to children and adults on a regular basis. Tech Support and a Knitting & Crafting Group are held regularly with other events and workshops as interest arises. We have increased our involvement to include co-sponsoring programs, such as working together with The Aging in Place Committee, the Community Center, and the Broadband Committee (with the subgroup of the Digital Equity Committee). We have a deep commitment to working collaboratively with other groups in town to continue to make our community a vibrant, thriving and caring place.

We are extremely thankful for the Eleanor Philbrick Trust for the Arts, which has supported the library in many ways, including some programming as well as the Maine artwork which continues to fill almost every available space!

We were able to complete some long overdue goals thanks to the generosity of Barbara Kennedy, who left money to the library in her will. Barbara’s gift enabled us to pave the library driveway, completely replace the heating system in the original part of the building, which included a new furnace as well as heat pumps upstairs. And, we were able to renovate the old attic which now allows access between the original building and the addition. This area will provide a welcoming reading room, and a lovely meeting space.

We have had 59 new patrons sign up for library cards over this past year which brings us now to over 900 people who currently have library cards. We are thrilled to have newcomers as well as longtime residents stop by to see what we are about. There were 2,970 visits to the library with a circulation of 7,681 materials. Our in-house collection, not counting what is available through the downloadable programs includes over 18, 800 materials. There is something for everyone at the library. We’d love you to stop by!

Road Commissioner's Report

This has been a year of climate change not only to our precious town but all over the State of Maine.

In my 40+ years living in Vienna and also as your Road Commissioner, I am shocked in how much time and money has gone into our roads from the May and December storms. All roads in town took a large toll. I have been working with FEMA at least 2-3 times a day with phone calls, to keep them abreast of what damage there has been in our town and ways to make needed repairs. Hopefully the town will see some relief funding in the coming months.

If the storms continue to have large impact on our town roads I will need to have a liaison work with FEMA and myself to document damage and take photos of those damages.

Work Done in 2023

- 1) Storm damage (5/1) Culvert replacement on Jesse Ladd, Kimball and Stream Roads. Many loads of gravel and stone were distributed throughout the town.
- 2) July – Stream Road, Klir Beck Road ditching work and resurfacing.
- 3) Graded Stream, Besse, Davis, Kimball Pond, Anderson and Cross Roads.
- 4) Cold patch roads around town due to erosion and pot holes
- 5) Additional grading was needed on all roads in November

My Goals in 2024

- 1) Keep roads open and passable when storms arise
- 2) Install larger culverts as needed
- 3) Ditching where needed
- 4) Grading and graveling all dirt roads to maintain their integrity

I would like to say thank you to the Vienna Fire Department, Lenny Meader & Sons, Troy Bean & Crew, Lee Fellman & Crew, Irene & Ron Goff and Trask Hill neighbors, Horne Construction and to my community members for your phone calls and assistance. Also, a special thank you to my wife for getting all the messages out to me during the storms.

30 Mile River Watershed Association

Vienna 2023 Snapshot:

- \$3,395 in annual funding from the Town
- 70 Vienna donors
- 47 volunteers providing 394 hours to support 30 Mile programs on Vienna lakes/ponds
- 690 CBI inspection hours and 992 inspections on Vienna's lakes/ponds (Parker and Flying)
- 29 sampling trips to monitor water quality in 4 Vienna lakes/ponds (Flying, Kimball, Parker, Whittier)
- 7 Vienna landowners received technical assistance for erosion problems
- 12 LakeSmart evaluations completed on Vienna's lakes/ponds
- 4 YCC projects completed on Flying Pond in Vienna
- 105 monthly newsletter subscribers from Vienna

Watershed Impact in 2023:

Water Quality Monitoring

Our staff completed a full season of monitoring on 13 lakes and ponds - expanding our monitoring of Echo Lake, and Hales, Kimball, Tilton & Whittier. Working with 27 volunteers, we completed 112 sampling events. For in-depth water quality reports for each lake, go to <https://30mileriver.org/water-quality-monitoring/>

In response to algal blooms on Androscoggin, we completed a 2nd season of intensified monitoring of the lake and its tributaries. We also applied for and were awarded a grant of \$150K to begin watershed remediation efforts.

Invasive Bladderwort in Tilton

In August, a new invasive plant, swollen bladderwort, was found in Tilton Pond at the top of the watershed. Our surveys confirmed that there is dense growth throughout the pond. In 2024, we will work to prevent its spread downstream to David Pond, Parker Pond, and beyond.

Invasive Milfoil in Androscoggin

Since it was first found in 2020, we have fought the infestation of invasive variable milfoil in Androscoggin Lake. For a 3rd summer, we successfully removed all plants found. We have kept it from spreading and are seeing fewer plants. We will continue the fight in 2024 to protect Androscoggin and all our lakes.

Our First Line of Defense

Our paid staff and 11 volunteer Courtesy Boat Inspectors conducted 2,584 inspections. Although it is rare for us to find an invasive species on a boat or trailer, all it takes is one fragment to start an infestation and ruin a lake.

Pocasset Watershed Survey

In September, we completed the Pocasset Lake Watershed Survey. 14 trained volunteers and 6 technical leaders surveyed the developed areas of the watershed, identifying 69 erosion sites that are impacting or have the potential to harm water quality. With this data, we will take steps to address erosion and better protect Pocasset.

Supporting Landowners

Our Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) completed 11 projects on 6 lakes and ponds in 2023 to address erosion problems harming water quality. Overall, we provided technical assistance to 33+ landowners.

LakeSmart

30 Mile is a regional LakeSmart “HUB” support center for this statewide program. LakeSmart would not be possible without our partner lake associations and the 15 volunteer coordinators and evaluators doing the work. In 2023, more than 20 LakeSmart evaluations were completed in the 30 Mile region, delivering landowner education property-by-property and shore-by-shore to create a conservation ethic across the lake community.

1st LakeSmart award on Kimball

With our goal of bringing the LakeSmart program and education to every lake and pond in the watershed, we are excited to announce the very first LakeSmart award on Kimball Pond in Vienna: Congratulations to Nancy Gregory & Tom Hale!

Boy Scout Island Restoration

After decades of use for picnicking and camping, Boy Scout Island on Flying Pond had degraded greatly due to overuse and abuse. Last summer, a major collaborative project between 30 Mile and the Flying Pond Improvement Association (FPIA) aimed to reverse the damage. 30 Mile’s YCC crew and FPIA volunteers transported 5 cubic yards of erosion control mulch to the island, established a new 200-foot stable path, and planted 40+ native trees, shrubs, and groundcovers. All summer, volunteers watered the new plantings and FPIA posted signage asking people to respect the island under restoration. In spring 2024, 30 Mile will install live stakes on the shoreline to establish buffer vegetation and prevent erosion.

Septic System Vulnerability Study & Permit Database Project

Thanks to grant from the Maine Outdoor Heritage Fund, 30 Mile is leading a new project that will assess the impact of septic systems within our watershed, and provide our partner towns with a town-wide septic system database and a tool for current and future septic permit and maintenance tracking. Project findings and an interactive septic risk map will be available on 30 Mile’s website in spring 2024.

Dear Vienna Residents,

This past year we celebrated the 35th anniversary of the Kennebec Land Trust (KLT). With generous support from community members, we have worked to conserve important lands; provide public access for hiking, paddling, skiing, blueberry picking, and hunting; and promote land stewardship, conservation education, and partnerships.

KLT has an impressive list of accomplishments: 7,753 acres under permanent conservation throughout our 413,000-acre service area; 58 miles of trails to explore; over 20 miles of conserved shoreline; and 1,100 household and business partner members.

As we look to the future, we will continue to conserve high value land and protect important wildlife habitat, and we're also offering programs to promote and expand conservation in ways that better serve our communities.

As the owner of the McGurdy Stream Preserve, Peter Miller Woodland, Storer Farm Community Preserve and Vienna Woods Conservation Area, KLT contributes to Vienna's local tax base through the open space tax program. KLT holds conservation easements on the Flying Pond Farm and Whittier Shoreland.

KLT offers a great selection of outings and educational programs for the public, and we collaborate with schools and other organizations to engage youth and share our conservation message with the community.

We welcome this opportunity to communicate with Vienna residents and the Select Board about our conservation work. Everyone is welcome to visit our properties and trails and to attend our public programs.

RSU 9 School Board Representative

Mount Blue Schools are currently doing well as students and families continue to bounce back after Covid-19. Some younger students continue to play catch up from the Covid-19 impact of remote learning. Our schools are working hard to help these students “catch up” and successfully integrate into their learning environment.

Cape Cod Hill Community School was designated a “community school” last April and since then has implemented a number of community oriented services to students and families. Cape Cod Hill is at the leading edge of this program which is being implemented in select schools around the state. These schools “participate in a community-based effort to coordinate and integrate educational, developmental, family, health and other comprehensive services through community-based organizations and public and private partnerships at school,” as well as “provides access to services under paragraph A to students, families and the community, such as access during the school year to services before school hours, after school hours and during the weekend, as well as access to such services during the summer” says social worker Amanda Clark. Positive student gains and increased attendance have already been observed in our students at Cape Cod Hill School.

Our district overwhelmingly approved purchasing the Holman House in Farmington from the Old South Church this fall, providing urgently needed space in a central location for administrative offices and private meeting spaces for sensitive meetings at the same time that it frees up much needed space in the high school. This purchase will completely use the balance of ESSER funds made available to our district through Federal funding sources related to Covid-19 without requiring our communities to fund the purchase through tax increases. We expect the administrative function of the Superintendent’s office to move this winter.

Mill Stream Grange 2023 Report

Mill Stream Grange has had a very good year. We have taken in new members and have continued with our community services. The Grange awards scholarships each year to a high school senior interested in agriculture. We present dictionaries to 3rd grade students in local schools. We strongly support the Mount Vernon Food Pantry. We have also had great luck opening our hall on Tuesdays for a day of crafting/sewing for any and all who are interested, not just Grangers.

Each year our Grange displays an exhibit at the Franklin County Fair filled with items we have made during the past year and raffle off a quilt made by our members.

Spring is fast approaching. As a reminder, pull your bird feeders early if you have had bear issues in the past.

Please keep your dogs on a leash when walking them and hooked/penned when you cannot keep a constant eye on them. Your help would be appreciated by your neighbors and friends. Livestock, ducks and chickens are required to be under your control and not allowed in the public right of way as this causes a public hazard. These are a few reminders to help pets and livestock to stay safe.

It is that time of year again to license your dogs. The town clerk has tried to call dog owners to remind them before February 1 to come in and register their dogs before the penalty starts. If you have discontinued your land-line phone number or changed your number, please call the Town Clerk to update your new phone number with her. For new residents, if your dogs are registered in your previous town, you need to update and transfer the dog registration to our town. By registering your dogs in Vienna, we will know who to return the dogs to. It is less stress on your pet and it will not cost you as much as when you go to the pound to retrieve your pet. The cost is \$6 for altered dogs and \$11 for un-altered dogs. State mandated late fees of \$25 start February 1.

As the Second Regular Session of the Maine State Legislature convenes, I would like to thank you for granting me the opportunity to serve the citizens of District 58 in the Maine House of Representatives. Representing you is an honor and a privilege I take seriously. This is a wonderful opportunity for me to make a difference in the community and I am looking forward to the new challenges that wait in the 2024 legislative session.

The First Regular Session of the Legislature was a busy one, as lawmakers faced many difficult issues and decisions. I believe you will be pleased with some of the accomplishments of the 131st Legislature so far. My colleagues and I were able to pass multiple bi-partisan spending agreements that included supporting hospitals and long-term care facilities, working to stabilize highway and road funding, and improving the efficient delivery of government services. Dear Friends:

It is an honor to serve the people of Maine in the U.S. Senate, and I welcome this opportunity to share an update on issues important to Maine and America.

One of my priorities for 2023 has been to improve the appropriations process in Congress – the way it decides how to spend taxpayer money. I took over as the Vice Chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee last year. Along with Chair Patty Murray, we decided the best change we could make was not to do something new. Instead, it was to do something old – that is, go back to the regular and transparent committee process that we used to have.

Part of restoring this process included holding 50 public Committee hearings, which allowed for input from senators on both sides of the aisle. As a result, for the first time in five years, the Senate Appropriations Committee passed all twelve of its funding bills on time. This was done with strong bipartisan support. In fact, seven of them passed unanimously.

Now, we need to work with the House of Representatives to pass these twelve bills and turn them into laws.

These bills contain funding for a wide range of Maine priorities, including support for the workforce at Bath Iron Works and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, our lobster industry, infrastructure improvements, affordable housing, biomedical research, veterans, and heating assistance programs like LIHEAP. These bills also contain nearly \$590 million in Congressionally Directed Spending for 231 projects throughout the State of Maine. These projects would help promote job creation, expand access to health care, and improve public safety, infrastructure, and important resources in communities across all 16 counties of our state. I will continue to work to get these bills signed into law in the new year.

On October 25, the horrific mass shooting in Lewiston claimed the lives of 18 Mainers and injured 13 others. In response, I led Maine's Congressional Delegation in requesting an independent investigation by the U.S. Army Inspector General into the events leading up to the shooting. On December 15, the Under Secretary of the Army wrote to inform me that such an investigation will take place, and the Army Inspector General has instructed her team to immediately begin preparing to conduct this investigation. While nothing can undo the events of October 25, I will continue to work to understand what happened and what could have been done differently, and to find answers for the victims, survivors, and their families.

No one works harder than the people of Maine, and this year I honored that work ethic when I cast my 8,855th consecutive roll call vote.

As we look ahead to 2024, I remain committed to addressing the concerns of Maine families and communities. If you need assistance or wish to share your thoughts, please do not hesitate to reach out to one of my six state offices.
