

Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Vienna, qualified by law to vote in Town Affairs, to assemble at the Community Building in said Town on Friday 13th day of March next at 4 p.m. – 8 p.m., with the Annual Meeting to begin Saturday, the 14th day of March at 9:00 a.m. at the Vienna Community Room, then and there to act upon the following articles, to wit:

Article 1

To choose a moderator to preside at the said meeting.

Article 2

To elect the Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 3

To hear and act upon the report of the Town Officers.

Article 4

To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for new computer and Trio software to provide a web-based program accessible by all administration, \$6995.

Recommended: Yes

Article 5

To fix and compensation for the following:

Recommended:

Selectman, Assessors, and Overseers of the Poor: \$6,500 each

Town Treasurer: \$6,500

Town Clerk: \$7,000 for Clerk/Register Services

\$4,500 for Vehicle Registration and Excise Tax Collection

State minimum wage for elections.

Collector of Real Estate Taxes: \$8,500

Road Commissioner: 2026 Maine D.O.T Road Foreman Rates

Article 6

To see if the Town will vote to make property taxes payable, on half of June 30th, 2026 and on September 30th, 2026 and that interest be charged on overdue taxes at the rate of 7% or the maximum amount allowed by state law if that is greater (per annum after those dates).

Recommended: Yes

Article 7

To see what annual Rate of Interest the Town will authorize to be paid upon all abatements.

Recommended: 3.5% or the minimum allowable by law.

Article 8

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for abatements.

Recommended: \$5,000

Article 9

To fix compensation for the following:

Article 10

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums for general government.

Recommended:

Administration: \$70,000
Insurance: \$17,000
Community Building: \$15,000 plus carry the 2025 balance to a Capital Improvement Fund for the Community Building.
Election: \$3,300
Contingency Fund: \$3,500

Article 11

To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to compensate deputies of the Town Clerk, Treasurer, and Tax Collector for training fees.

Recommended: \$600

Article 12

To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to compensate Town Officials for attending court, judicial proceedings, and mandatory regional meetings.

Recommended: Carry the balance

Article 13

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate to pay the interest of a Tax Anticipation

Note (TAN)

Recommended: Carry the balance

Article 14

To see if the Town will authorize the Tax Collector to receive prepayments of taxes, these being tax payments made before the formal date of Tax Commitment.

Recommended: Yes

Article 15

To see if the Town will authorize the Treasurer to charge a fee to cover the Town's costs of processing bank checks with insufficient funds.

Recommended: \$30.00 per check

Article 16

To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to spend 25% of the Annual Budget in each Account from January 1, 2027 to the date of the 2027 Annual Town Meeting.

Article 17

To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the future replacement of the town fire truck.

Recommended: \$7,000 and carry the balance

Article 18

To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Fire Department's Operating expenses.

Recommended: \$40,500 and carry any 2025 balance to the Fire Department Capital Improvement Reserve Account.

Article 19

To fix compensation for the Officers of the Fire Department.

Recommended: Chief - \$2,500

Deputy Chief - \$2,000

Assistant Chiefs - \$1,500

Article 20

To fix compensation for the services of the Volunteer Fire Fighters for attendance at Training Sessions and Fire Calls.

Recommended: State Minimum Wage

Article 21

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Fire Department vaccination and/or OSHA respirator medical examination.

Recommended: Carry the balance

Article 22

To see what the sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Town of Mt. Vernon for the Rescue squad.

Recommended: \$3,500

Article 23

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Winter Road Work.

Recommended: \$210,000

Article 24

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Road Maintenance Account.

Recommended: \$95,000 and carry the 2025 balance to the Paving Account

Article 25

To see what sum the town will raise and/or appropriate for the Paving Account.

Recommended: \$115,000 (\$95,000 to be raised and appropriated, plus approximately \$24,000 to be appropriated from the State Local Road Assistance Grant – actual amount based on actual receipts) and carry the 2025 balance

Article 26

To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for a major culvert and road repair on the Trask Road.

Recommended: \$20,000 and carry the balance

Article 27

To see what sum the Town will raise and/or appropriate for General Assistance.

Recommended: \$1,500 plus reimbursement from the state based on actual receipts.

Article 28

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Waste Management Account.

Recommended: \$89,000

Article 29

To fix compensation for the Animal Control Officer.

Recommended: \$3,000

Article 30

To see what sum the Town will raise and/or appropriate for the Animal Control Account.

Recommended: \$4,850 (\$4,300 to be raised and appropriated, plus approximately \$550 to be appropriated from the Town Animal registration Fees-actual amount based on actual receipts) and carry the 2025 balance

Article 31

To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the 30-Mile River Association.

Recommended: \$5,000 (from the 30-Mile River Association)

Article 32

To see if the Town will appropriate the Town Boat Excise Tax (up to \$800-actual amount based on actual receipts) to the 30 Mile River Watershed Association to be used for projects in Vienna.

Article 33

To fix compensation for the following:

Plumbing Inspector

Code Enforcement Officer

Recommended for each; \$25.00 per hour plus fees, milage.

(unless otherwise negotiated) Including fees for continuing mandatory education

Article 34

To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Plumbing Inspector Account.

Recommended: \$1,000 plus plumbing inspector fees
(Actual amounts based on actual receipts)

Article 35

To see if the Town will vote to approve a Commercial Solar Energy Systems Ordinance.

Recommended: Yes, from the Planning Board.

Article 36

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell a part of the Old Dump land parcel, money used for matching grants for culvert projects within the Town.

Recommended: Any money left over after the 2026 Grant projects, will be carried over for future Matching grant road projects within the Town.

Article 37

To see if the town will raise and appropriate money with matching funds for culvert project on Tower rd.

Recommended: \$40,000

Article 38

To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for one-time repairs at the Franklin Cemetery (from the Franklin Cemetery Association)

Recommended: \$1,650

Article 39

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for the Code Enforcement Account.

Recommended: \$1,500 plus code enforcement fees.
(actual amounts based on actual receipts)

Article 40

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate to contract with the State of Maine, Department of Public safety or other agencies, to provide Public Safety Dispatching And PSAP services for the Town of Vienna.

Recommended: \$6,000

Article 41

To see what sum the town will raise and appropriate for the following:

Seavey Cemetery: \$1,300
Town Park: \$600
Town Landfill: \$200

Article 42

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Veteran's Cemetery Markers and Flags:

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for assessing pick-up work.

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Special Accounts:

Article 45

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Street Lights.

Recommended: \$2,000

Article 46

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Legal Services.

Recommended: \$1,000 and carry the balance

Article 47

To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Ambulance Service.

Recommended: \$22,000

Article 48

To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate for Payroll Taxes.

Recommended: \$7,500

Article 49

To if the Town will allow lien fees (up to \$2,000-actual amounts based on actual costs) to be appropriated from the property taxes.

Article 50

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into multi-year contracts (i.e. Waste Management, Snow Removal).

Article 51

To see if the town will appropriate the State Snowmobile Registration reimbursement to the Vienna Mountaineers Snowmobile Club.

Article 52

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to take money from Surplus to cover Overdrafts in the 2026 accounts.

Article 53

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen, on behalf of the Town, to retain, sell or dispose of any Real Estate acquired by the Town for the non-payment of taxes after the date of foreclosure, on such terms as they deem advisable, after a posting of 60 days in the Town, and a notice given in the Franklin Journal, local media outlet, and the Town website, the Town Hereby will authorize the Selectmen to execute a quitclaim deed for the properties sold.

Article 54

To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to retain, sell or dispose of Surplus Town Property, on such terms as they deem advisable, after a posting of 30 days in the Town and a notice given on the Town Website.

Article 55

To see if the Town will accept the following Municipal, State, and Federal Funds in the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2026 unless otherwise designated, to reduce the tax commitment: (Figures are approximate, actual amounts based on actual receipts)

- Car, truck excise tax (\$100,000)
- Boat excise (\$900)
- Lien income (\$2,000)
- Tax interest (\$10,000)
- Fees from Town Clerk & State Agent fees (\$2,500)
- Fees from Animal Control (\$500)
- Building, Plumbing, and Code Enforcement permits (\$1,500)
- Municipal Revenue Sharing (\$70,000)
- Local Road Assistance (\$24,600)
- State Aid to Education (Including Federal Pass-through Funds and Property Tax Relief)
- Public Library State Aid
- Civil Emergency Funds
- Snowmobile Registration Reimbursements
- Tree Growth/Veterans Reimbursements (\$5,500)
- General Assistance Reimbursements
- Maine State Emergency Management Agency Reimbursements
- Federal Emergency Management Agency Funds
- Maine State and Federal Funds and Grants not listed above, also to include individual Gifts, Grants, and Funds not listed.
